

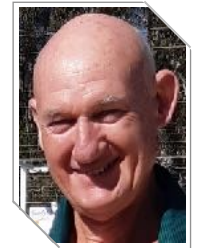

From the Chairperson, October 2023



I have been away for the past 7 weeks, and it is good to be back playing bowls and working with "The Team". I would like to thank Vice Chairperson Tim Carlton for his efforts during my absence, and for keeping me up to date with events.

As usual, and not to be underestimated, is a HUGE thank you to all the volunteers that help make this club work. Men's and Ladies committees, bar RSA's and bar staff, sponsorship team, day selectors and all willing workers. You can all be proud of yourselves and each other. Keep up the good work.

As all are aware, we have a new landlord in CPS, with the sale going through from the RSL. In the short period that CPS has been responsible for the property, it has addressed a number of long standing issues associated with the maintenance of the greens, and has been responsive to the Bowling Club's request for action on other maintenance issues as they have arisen.

CPS has already arranged for the purchase of a replacement mower and other machinery to assist in improving the state of the greens. They have also commissioned an audit of the irrigation system with a view to improving its effectiveness in light of a forecast hot dry summer ahead of us. This audit has been finalised and CPS has approved the works necessary to address the issues identified in the audit.

CPS is currently looking at options to provide air conditioning to the bar area following the complete breakdown of the old air conditioning system. A workable solution has been found and that is to put in 2 ceiling mounted 14kw package systems to get us through the summer with these being used in the final refurbishment. The contractor advises that these units are available and should be able to start working on October 19 and have it finished by the 25th.

To all those members not enjoying good health, I wish you a speedy recovery and a successful return to the greens.

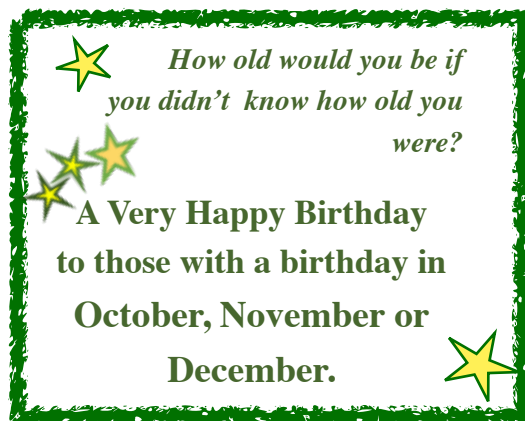

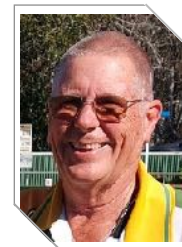

Greens Director Report: Greenkeeper Matt Butler has resigned from Green Options. Matt has done a great job working under the constraints we all know. We enter into a precarious stage with our greens and the forecast El Nino weather pattern in keeping the greens alive with our forever-failing irrigation system. Equipment purchased by CPS has made a huge difference and the irrigation system is being addressed. Greens are running quicker and hardening up as well. New Greenkeeper Rhys Thurlow commenced on the greens Tuesday 3rd Oct. Rhys was our green keeper some years ago.

Good Liaison between our Vice Chairman Tim Carlton and CPS gives us comfort that they are trying to move quickly forward in support of our greens and the bowls club. We do expect we will soon know a time plan of actions & developments with the Club and our greens transitioning to synthetic greens.

Welcome to the Green *The Etiquette of Bowls*

Just a few things to help make the game enjoyable.

Before starting the game meet and greet the players from both teams while the skips decide who has the mat.

When you are marking the end don't stand behind the jack and try not to move around as it may distract the bowler at the other end who is delivering the bowl.

When all the bowls have been delivered leave it to the markers to check who has the points, the other bowlers should stay off the green until the bowls have to be kicked back.

All bowlers should help to move the bowls back when possible.

The lead who won the end should place the mat so that everyone knows how far to kick them back.

When the bowler comes to the mat look to the skip for any instructions.

After the skip has delivered the last bowl of the end played, the other skip should lift the mat and place it on the wall.

After the game, shake hands and thank all the players for the game.

Bongaree Bowls Club Craft Group

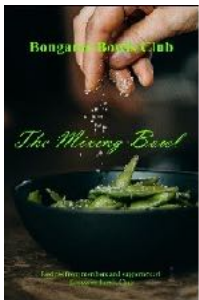
