Coaching Co-ordinator's Report

Over the last 12 months approximately 46 new bowlers have joined the club.

Our "Mentoring New Bowlers Team" of Tim Carlton, Jaarpung Blundell, Carol Oates & Steve Mogan are always available to new bowers. Seek them out when you are ready to start playing.



Stay in touch with your Coach for assistance when needed.

Best experience you can get is jumping into a game whatever day/s suit you. If you bowl once a week, you know how to play bowls.

If you bowl twice a week (including Rollups) your focus changes to get your line & length correct. Bowling three days a week, you are becoming serious and want to achieve. Even our Gun Bowlers in the club can mostly only get 50% of their bowls within 30cms of the Jack.

A good bowler would be considered having at least 75% plus accuracy.

If anyone wishes to test this out come along and do a 48-bowl test. Only a couple of bowlers in the club have been successful in getting a 75% result.

Skills/Drills continue on Thursdays at 10am. These are drills set out for you simulating scenarios that happen on the green. It is not just straight Draw to the Jack. Often it can be Draw a Positional Bowl, Drive, Conversion Shot and more.

We are running a modified Marker's Course, about 2 hours duration, on a Thursday at 10am. Put your name on the list on the noticeboards or advise me.

Markers are required for each game of Singles and is a responsibility of all players when playing Singles competitions, (except when playing a Final).

If you nominate for a Singles competition you need to have a Marker for your game. The Runner Up in a game (there are no losers) is to be prepared to be a Marker for the following game in the competition. Most experienced/senior bowlers will be open to this to assist your game.


